

## **2/2/06 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLANNING WORKGROUP MEETING NOTES**

### **Continuing Public Participation Efforts**

- Update public library materials once Chapters II and IV have been revised and Chapter III has been approved and revised by the Comprehensive Planning Board (CPB)
- The Ozaukee County multi-jurisdictional comprehensive plan or comprehensive planning in general could be a debate topic for local school debate teams
- Tom Dueppen of the Ozaukee County Planning, Resources, and Land Management Department (PRLM) could include comprehensive planning in his work with local schools
- The backpack program at local schools should be used to raise awareness among parents and children of the Ozaukee County comprehensive plan and multi-jurisdictional planning process and upcoming opportunities to provide input in the planning process including the countywide design workshop
- Comprehensive planning could be incorporated in “future cities” projects at local schools
- Run Public Informational Meeting (PIM) invitations and fast fact graphics on local cable access channels
- Notify local chambers of commerce of PIMs and send invitations to members

### **County Comprehensive Plan Design Workshop**

- The location will be the Grafton Elementary School gym in Grafton from 9 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
- Publicity strategies:
  - Backpack program
  - Run County design workshop invitations on local cable access channels
  - Notify local chambers of commerce, send invitations to members
  - Notify the OCEDC Inc.
  - Create handout for distribution and libraries similar to the fold out Chicago Transportation Plan. The handout should include a notification of the design workshop, County “fast facts”, general Ozaukee County comprehensive planning information, and contact information
  - Use yard signs and banners

- Design workshop Stations:
  - Information stations organized around the nine required comprehensive plan elements, similar to PIM stations. Each station will include maps and handouts conveying inventory information and comment boards
  - A station with cluster subdivision display boards including the cost implications of cluster subdivisions compared to traditional subdivision developments
  - A sustainable development station, including information regarding the health implications of various types of development and transportation facilities
  - GIS smart board or hardcopy map exercise station allowing attendees to create and discuss alternative development and land use scenarios
  - Continuously scrolling visual preference survey with scoring sheets
  - Map my home exercise as a sign-in to the event. Attendees would place a sticker on a large County map where their home is located as they sign-in for the workshop
  - No formal process to the program, attendees will be able to move from station to station at their own pace
