

The Criminal Justice Collaborating Council met in room 240 of the Ozaukee County Justice Center.

Meeting called to order by Vice-Chairman Lieutenant James Johnson at 3 :09

The meeting was properly noticed and the motion to adopt the agenda was made by Cindy Bock and seconded by Judge Grundahl. Motion carried.

Approval of April 30 meeting minutes – motion made by Cindy Bock with a second by Shea Halula to approve the minutes with the following correction: The motion to approve the March meeting minutes was made by Laurie Vandenberg (not Beth Hodorowski). Motion carried.

Lieutenant Johnson distributed the Project Position Paper (DRAFT) entitled

“Ozaukee County Criminal Justice Collaborating Council – Reducing Crime Related to Alcohol and Substance Misuse” prepared by Chairperson Dale Bospalec. The committee discussed the document and recommended the following changes: The term “Crime” will be replaced with the term “offenses” throughout the document to be able to include those who receive municipal citations rather than being charged with a crime. With regard to the standing sub-committees: the word “programs” will be added in parentheses following Treatment and an additional sub-committee “Funding” will be added. In the Outcomes/Goals section – these were reworded as follows:

1. Change “crime” to “offenses”
2. Change “crime” to “offenses”
3. Change to “Specifically reduce the number of persons driving under the influence in the county
4. Change to “Specifically reduce the number of DUI incidents in the county”
5. Add this outcome/goal: Specifically reduce recidivism for alcohol/drug related offenses.

General discussion about the elements of the position paper included:

- The gathering of statistical data will continue – Anthony Werth provided statistics about operating while intoxicated offenses in the county but is waiting for the State Patrol report which should add to the numbers.
- Judge Grundahl will invite the Clerk of the Mid-Moraine Municipal Court to work with us – it was noted that Ozaukee County residents who appear in the Municipal court are listed as Washington County arrests because of the location

of the court. The clerk should be able to assist in more accurate reporting of our numbers.

- The structure of the CJCC will be such that the “Committee of the Whole” will meet quarterly with the sub-committees meeting as “work groups” in between and reporting to the CJCC at each of the quarterly meetings.
- It must be determined who will staff the CJCC meetings and how communications will be handled. Because the CJCC is a sub-committee of the Health and Human Services committee, it should be someone from that department who is assigned to those tasks. Members need to know who they should send information to and who will be sending out committee information.

The role of the sub-committees/work-groups was defined as follows – each will research /explore:

What’s currently available in our county? What successful models exist that we could use in our county? What gaps/obstacles exist? What measurement tools/predictors will be used?

The following committee assignments were made:

- i. Prevention/Early Identification – Shea Halula, Joanne Manion
- ii. Adjudication – Anthony Werth, Judge Grundahl, Judge McCormick
- iii. Treatment/Programs – Laurie Vandenberg, Cindy Bock
- iv. Law Enforcement – Lieut. Johnson, Captain Ebert
- v. Community Re-Entry – Tom Kopp
- vi. Funding – Cindy Bock, Beth Hodorowski

The committees are reminded to focus on alcohol/drug misuse and the outcomes/goals in our position paper. They should involve/invite any number of people that can help provide the information needed to be involved in their work group. They should report their progress/updates by the last week of each month to the CJCC Chairperson.

A discussion was held about who else should be included in the CJCC with the recommendation that representation from probation/parole be included as well as representation from the school districts.

The county website should be upgraded to include the listing of CJCC members, the position paper (once approved), the subcommittees/workgroups, as well as posting the meeting agendas and minutes.

The members decided on their quarterly meeting dates as follows:

August 27, 2008 - November 19, 2008 (change made because of the Thanksgiving holiday) – February 25, 2009 – May 27, 2009 – August 26, 2009.

These meetings will be held in the Jury Room (Rm 240) in the Ozaukee County Criminal Justice Center. Subcommittees/workgroups will each determine their own meeting dates/times/locations.

*Members of the CJCC not present at this meeting should indicate which subcommittee/workgroup they would like to participate in and notify one of the current members of that group or the CJCC chairperson.

Motion to adjourn at 4:55pm by Beth Hodorowski, second by Judge Grundahl. Motion carried.
