COMMUNICATIONS:

Speed on STH 32 from Port Washington to Misty Ridge Lane. DOT survey reduce speed to 45. Port Washington Police Department and Ozaukee Sheriff doing speed enforcement in that area.

Letter from Mr. Fix to reduce speed limit on Green Bay Road. Lt. McCormick-no excessive speeds, minimal crashes. Mr. Dreblow advised Mr. Fix that no action is to be taken.
