

Criminal Justice Collaborating Council 2/24/10 Minutes

The Criminal Justice Collaborating Council met in room 211 of the Ozaukee County Justice Center.

Call to Order/Proper Notice/Adoption of Agenda: Meeting was called to order by Co-chair Cpt. Johnson at 3:05 pm. The meeting was properly noticed, the agenda was adopted.

Financial Report/Grant Writing Report:

Family Living Educator Carol Bralich prepared and presented the 2009 CJCC annual budget summary. \$414 was paid to Women's Lifeline Inc. on 6/11/09 for resource display cases. The \$2500 donation was the result of the proceeds from this year's autumn open. The CJCC account total reflects \$11,586. The CJCC account is no longer under the Health and Human Services Committee, but rather under an administrative fund. A motion was made by Dawn Ritter and seconded by Dan Buntrock to accept the financial report.

UW-Extension Family Living Report:

Carol Bralich presented the 2009 Annual Executive Report to the Council which will be submitted by March 5 to the County. Carol also gave Council members a copy of a rating form entitled "Key Ingredients of Effective Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Programs" designed by Mary Huser and Stephen Small from the University of Wisconsin-Madison/Cooperative Extension. This rating form could be utilized by any standing committee screening possible quality and research based programs to be used in Ozaukee County's Justice System.

Anthony Werth reported that Ozaukee County has been excluded from the ATR3 grant regional area. He will inquire at next Wiser Choice meeting why Ozaukee County was excluded. On March 19 Anthony Werth and Cindy Bock will travel to see the Winnebago Model.

Community Reentry:

Tom Kopp reported on the Freedom Life Skills program. Glenn Zipperer observed program in Green Bay and feels favorable to the program. The subcommittee is continuing to assess the program and will meet to determine if the program should be presented to the full Council in April.

Action Items:

Membership Voting and Approvals:

Candidates for CJCC citizen representative and municipal attorney representatives were introduced and were offered a chance to explain their interest in being a member of the Council. Voting was done by silent ballot with four candidates for citizen representative and two for municipal attorney. The 2 new citizen representatives are Paul Gantner and Kelly Evenson. The municipal attorney representative will be Johnathan Woodward. In addition the Council approved Steve Shaw and Bill Harbron as the designee and alternate as selected by the Ozaukee County Superintendents.

Discussion Items:

Additional CJCC full Council meeting dates:

Due to the time necessary for finalizing the Council's organizational structure and new membership, additional meetings were scheduled for the following dates: Wednesday March 24th, Wednesday April 28th and Wednesday May 26th. All meetings will be held at 3:00 pm in Jury Assembly Room 211 at the Justice Center.

Guest Speaker:

Marilyn Walczak, Community Justice Project Manager, from Justice 2000 in Milwaukee County presented information about her organization in a question/answer format to the Council. Organizational details were provided in a summary paper, which include the organization's structure, corporate staffing, municipal court alternatives program, pretrial community supervision and case management units, GPS monitoring, release planning team, Milwaukee County's Treatment and Diversion Program (TAD) and Failure to

Appear/Bench Warrant Surrender Program. Justice 2000 has contracted with both Racine and Outagamie Counties to assist them in creating their own program. Marilyn offered to meet with our county if there is interest as well.

Other points of mention:

- Becky Young Reintegration Funds- Requests for proposals should be coming from DOC
- J2000 created own database for court programs, could help us look into creating our own for Ozaukee County
- Community Justice Act-involves citizens and local government by granting funds to local units of government and community agencies to develop correctional sanctions and services at the local level. Marilyn will send information in the future.
