

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING



Daniel O'Neil *Agriculture*

- ◆ I taught session eight of the master gardener general training class. This session includes phenology, pest control, and integrated pest management. We currently have thirty six students enrolled in this years training class. Remaining classes will cover fruit, vegetables, woody perennials and native plants.
- ◆ The Ozaukee County 4-H Livestock Association has selected their educational programs for the 2005-06 program years. In addition to coordinating the educational sessions for the organization, the Livestock Board revised the bylaws to better describe the organizations officer responsibilities.



Kay Buelke Schroeder *4-H & Youth Development*

- ◆ Ozaukee County 4-H will be participating in a Tri-county program called "Eating Well-Being Active-Retrofit Yourself" with a special emphasis on making positive choices with nutrition and fitness. A youth member and adult leader are part of the planning team to create educational activities for club meetings and plan a county bike ride for 2006.
- ◆ The "Circle of Courage" character education program will be taught at Grafton Elementary School by the 4-H Ambassadors beginning in November. Currently planning is taking place with the GES guidance counselor, new Ambassadors are being recruited and training will take place soon after selection is completed.



Mary Fran Lepeska *Family Living*

- ◆ Taught key basic **food safety** concepts to over 80 boy scouts and leaders at a tri-county camp cookery where the boys used the knowledge as they prepared evening meals.
- ◆ Shared information about **Get Checking** and **Financial Counseling** program with Grafton State Bank employees. Four additional residents began work with volunteer financial coaches/counselors.
- ◆ Seventeen childcare providers learned about how to work with active children, and match their activity level with the children's level.
- ◆ **Port-Saukville United for Youth** is working on a second Youth Friendly Business award and making plans to work with Marcus on a community service project.



Paul Roback *Community Development*

- ◆ Presented at the First Friday Forum at MATC entitled "A Strong Regional Economy– Why is it important for Ozaukee County?" Through evaluation, participants gained a greater understanding of how Ozaukee is part of a regional economy (4.8 on a 5-point scale). The following organizations requested copies of this presentation; Columbia St. Mary's Hospital, Milwaukee Area Technical College, United Way of Greater Milwaukee, Spirit of Milwaukee and Miller Engineers Scientists.
- ◆ Coordinated with SEWRPC on the October 2005 Comprehensive Planning Web Update, which is e-mailed to Comprehensive Planning Board members, Citizen Advisory Committee members, local elected officials and interested citizens.
- ◆ E-mailed members of the Local Ozaukee Government Information Network (LOGIN) a document entitled "A FORMULA FOR DECLINE: Lessons from Colorado for States Considering TABOR."
