

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING



Daniel O'Neil *Agriculture*

- ◆ Completed dairy modernization plans for seven farms with David Kammel of the UW Madison Biological Systems Engineering Department. These farms will not plan for the implementation steps for completing these expansion projects.
- ◆ Completed a question and answer session with Dr. Nino Ridgeway for Master gardeners, and the public on current horticultural topics. Samples and questions were brought in from throughout the county, and lasted for about 90 minutes.
- ◆ Provided support to the Ozaukee County Yard and Garden Line volunteers in the busiest spring call season. The new and returning workers will attend an all day orientation in Madison on June 5th. This training day is provided by UW Madison experts, and Ozaukee County typically brings the largest number of volunteers to participate in this excellent training opportunity.



Kay Buelke Schroeder *4-H & Youth Development*

- ◆ Our 4-H Summer Camp Program has twenty-seven youth and eleven adult volunteers who will serve in cabin counselor and resource staff roles at 4-H camp. In a day long workshop taught by 4-H youth development professionals, youth and adults planned their theme programs, resource areas, cabin responsibilities and campfire programs. ALL youth will teach a 15 minute session during the "Trekking the Trails at Upham Woods" theme program. Resource staff plan and teach hour long programs with campers. Participation at camp this year will be 81 base camp campers, 28 outpost campers, 27 youth and 13 adult staff for a total of 149. Summer camp provides one of the best youth leadership and skill development experiences available for 4-H members.
- ◆ Twenty youth and twelve parents attended the First Time Camper Orientation Program that I taught with youth camp staff. Parents indicated in the written evaluation an increased comfort level in understanding the purpose of 4-H camp, knowing the camp activities, training youth and adults receive and the responsibilities of each camp staff member.



Mary Fran Lepeska *Family Living*

- ◆ Did **Credit** presentations to two Single Living Port Washington HS classes, and the students played the Credit Jeopardy game, a fun way to review the credit terms and information they had learned.
- ◆ Taught "**Who Gets Grandma's Yellow Pie Plate?**" to 10 individuals who shared positive feedback, rating the presentation 4.8 on a 1 (not valuable) to 5 (very valuable). All indicated they are better prepared to participate in family decision making for later life and that they plan to discuss transfer of non-titled property with family members and make a list of special objects to transfer to others.
- ◆ Facilitated "**How to Get Parents on Your Team**", the last program in the Better Kid Care series, to 8 child care providers.
- ◆ Facilitated **United for Youth** small group discussion around ways to make the PW-Sauville communities more youth friendly. The 6 groups generated over 60 ideas that were shared with the Port Washington BID, and one or more ideas will be selected to be worked on for the 2006-07 school term. The group elected new officers for 06-07.



Paul Roback *Community Development*

- ◆ Coordinated First Friday Forum entitled "Recreational Opportunities in Ozaukee County." Presenters included representatives from the Mequon Nature Preserve, the Cedarburg Cultural Center and the Ozaukee Interurban Trail. Twenty-eight participants gained a greater understanding of these topics (a 5.0 on a 5-point scale!).
- ◆ Co-facilitated a design-workshop / open house for the Ozaukee County Comprehensive Planning Process. Over 60 participants attended this event and gained knowledge on Comprehensive Planning and Ozaukee's planning process through 13 interactive work stations. Overall, participants evaluated the workshop as excellent (a 4.5 on a 5-point scale).
