PESTICIDE APPLICATOR  
CERTIFICATION & RECERTIFICATION**

Is your Pesticide Certification card still good or has it expired? Or, do you need to be certified to use restricted use pesticides?

During the past years, many new products have been classified as restricted use. This requires the user to be certified to purchase and use the product.

There are two ways to become certified or recertified. One is to attend a one-day certification program. Programs will be offered at the following area locations and dates.

**January 13, 2010 at the Public Agency Center (PAC), 333 E. Washington St., West Bend.**

**February 24, 2010 at the Ozaukee County Administration Center, 121 W. Main Street, Port Washington.**

**Proof of identification is required before you may take the exam.** Pre-registration begins at 8:30 a.m. Sessions start at 9:00 a.m. and finish about 4:00 p.m.

In order to attend, it is necessary to register in advance by using the enclosed registration form. Registrations should be received one week prior to the session you plan to attend.

**Check the expiration date on your card!**

Your certification must expire within the next 12 months to take the class this year.

The University of Wisconsin provides the educational program. The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection issues the certificate, and the certificate is good for five years.

These sessions are for private applicators, not commercial applicators. A private applicator is a person who purchases, mixes or loads, applies, or directs the use of any pesticide for the purpose of producing any agricultural commodity on property owned or rented by the person or the person's employer. Commercial applicators are certified at area meetings. Contact the UW-Extension office for a list of commercial certification sessions.

The second way to become certified is to purchase the study materials and study on your own. When you are ready, arrange to take the evaluation at the UW-Extension office. When using the self-study method, a passing score of over 70% is needed on the evaluation. When the evaluation is taken at a session, the score must be over 50%.
