

**COUNTY BOARD OF CANVASSERS
PARTISAN PRIMARY
AUGUST 9, 2022**

The Ozaukee County Board of Canvass met Tuesday, August 16, 2022 in Room 118 of the Administration Center for the purpose of canvassing the August 9, 2022 Partisan Primary Election.

Meeting called to order at 8:02am.

Present: County Clerk Winkelhorst, Patti Spencer, Carol Boettcher and Chief Deputy County Clerk Lisa Henning.

County Clerk Winkelhorst reviewed the steps taken to prepare for the County Board of Canvassers. The Board of Canvass accepted the information.

There are no registered write-in candidates for the Ozaukee County races. The registered write-in candidate for Lieutenant Governor (Democratic) is listed on the write-in tally sheets and the valid write-in votes received for each reporting unit have been tallied. County Clerk Winkelhorst explained that votes for nonregistered write-in candidates in offices where there is no ballot candidate or a ballot candidate is deceased must be recorded on the tally sheets. All votes for nonregistered write-in candidates remain in “scattering”.

There were no provisional ballots cast in Ozaukee County. The following are the findings, by reporting unit, of the Board of Canvassers upon review of the election results.

The Inspectors’ Statement indicates that one (1) absentee ballot was rejected as the voter did not vote in the “Party Preference” section and the ballot contained crossover votes; therefore, the election inspectors could not determine voter intent. The Board of Canvassers determined that the absentee ballot should not

have been rejected; the override function on the ICE machine should have been used to process the ballot. The Board of Canvassers opened the Certificate of Rejected Absentee Ballot Envelope (EL-102) which contained one (1) ballot. The ballot, which was incorrectly rejected, will be counted. The voter was assigned voter #728 in the poll book. There were no candidate totals to adjust as voter intent could not be determined. The Town Clerk will be notified to be sure the voter is given voter participation in WisVote. The Board of Canvassers placed the ballot into a ballot bag and sealed with seal #00107000.

Town of Grafton:

The Inspectors’ Statement indicates that two (2) absentee ballots were rejected as the voters only voted in the “Party Preference” section and not for any candidates. The Board of Canvassers determined that the absentee ballots should not have been rejected; the override function on the ICE machine should have been used to process the ballots. The Board of Canvassers opened the Certificate of Rejected Absentee Ballot Envelope (EL-102) which contained two (2) ballots. The ballots, which were incorrectly rejected, will be counted. The voters were assigned voter #702 and #703 in the poll book. There were no candidate totals to adjust as only the Party Preference section was marked. The Town Clerk will be notified to be sure the voters are given voter participation in WisVote. The Board of Canvassers placed the ballots into a ballot bag and sealed with tamper evident seal #00106731.

The Inspectors’ Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 471 ballots. Two (2) voters from Ward 2 inadvertently received Ward 3 ballots. The total number of ballots for Wards 2 & 3 equals 913. The total number of voters for Wards 2 & 3 equals 913.

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 571 ballots. Twenty-one voters inadvertently received a Ward 4 ballot. The total number of ballots counted for both reporting units equals 1085. The total number of voters for both reporting units equals 1085.

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 325 ballots. One (1) voter inadvertently received a Ward 7,8 ballot. The total number of ballots counted for both reporting units equals 884. The total number of voters for both reporting units equals 884.

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 559 ballots. One (1) voter inadvertently received a Ward 6 ballot. The total number of ballots counted for both reporting units equals 884. The total number of voters for both reporting units equals 884.

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 729 ballots. One (1) voter inadvertently received a Ward 10,11A ballot. The total number of ballots counted for both reporting units equals 979. The total number of voters for both reporting units equals 979.

The Inspectors' Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 250 ballots. One (1) voter inadvertently received a Ward 9,11 ballot. The total number of ballots counted for both reporting units equals 979. The total number of voters for both reporting units equals 979.

The Board of Canvassers questioned the reasons for the rejected ballots as the reasons written were not clear/legible. The Board of Canvassers opened the Certificate of Rejected Absentee Ballot Envelope (EL-102) to review the application/certification envelopes (EL-122) to determine the exact reason for

rejection and to be certain the ballots were rejected correctly. The Board of Canvassers determined the ballots were rejected correctly and resealed the application/certification envelopes in a new Certificate of Rejected Absentee Ballot Envelope (EL-102).

City of Mequon:

ICE - 1062 Voter List – 1064

The Inspectors’ Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 1062 ballots. Voter #240 was originally assigned to an absentee ballot voter but was later rejected due to missing witness signature. Voter #240 was not reused and Voter #536 was not used; therefore, the total number of ballots equals the total number of voters.

The Inspectors’ Statement indicates the ballots were manually counted: 481 ballots. The poll books were reconciled: 482 voters. The absentee ballot application/certification envelopes (EL-122) were reviewed to be sure all ballots were processed. It is possible that a voter left the polling location with their ballot as earlier in the day a voter attempted to leave with their ballot but was stopped by election inspectors.
